MEETING OF THE BA LEGAL AFFAIRS AND SECURITY COMMITTEE

THE BA COMMITTEE IS DISCUSSING EXTERNAL THREATS AND THE COMMON SECURITY POLICY



At its meeting in the Seimas, the Legal Affairs and Security Committee of the Baltic Assembly has mainly been focusing on the recent geopolitical changes and the ensuing threats and security measures.

Virginija Baltraitienė, Chairperson of the BA Legal Affairs and Security Committee and Minister of Agriculture of Lithuania, expresses the urge to ensure national defence in different areas and not to rely on allied assistance alone. The Chairperson of the Committee notes that the US have been listed as the most powerful among militaries while Russia takes the second place (and in terms of some specific criteria, Russia goes ahead the strengths of the US by having, for example, more tanks

and nuclear warheads). She says that, in this context, none of the Baltic States is even close to the first group of 35 countries on this list. "Of course, we can't compete with the leading military powers, but we should not under-estimate our potential. Yes, we are taking part in missions and we maintain our militaries, however, we are still very vulnerable. Don't we rely too much on external assistance?" the Chairperson questions.

AT THE BA COMMITTEE MEETING: "WE ARE READY TO INTENSIFY DEFENCE COOPERATION"



At its meeting in the Seimas, the Legal Affairs and Security Committee of the Baltic Assembly discussed the strengthening of cooperation of the Baltic States in the areas of foreign and security policy. The participants of the meeting focused on joint procurements of military equipment, joint trainings of the Baltic States, joint actions and other issues.

Saulius Gasiūnas, Director of the Euro-Atlantic Cooperation Department, Ministry of National Defence of Lithuania, reassures the members of the BA Committee that we are ready to intensify defence cooperation. "Russia, our potential enemy or opponent, treats us as a single military operational space. [...] If they are holding a large-scale exercise, such as

Zapad, involving hundreds of thousands of units of military equipment, they are following a scenario against the three Baltic States altogether and even against a wider region, including Poland and other countries," says the representative of the Ministry of National Defence.

Valerijus Simulik, Chairman of the BA Committee on Education, Science and Culture, emphasised the importance of education and research for countries' competitiveness and the society's economic and social welfare.

BA EDUCATION, SCIENCE AND CULTURE COMMITTEE: CIVIL DEFENCE TRAINING IS BECOMING A MATTER OF NATIONAL SECURITY



BA Education, Science and Culture Committee members together with representatives of the Lithuanian Ministry of National Defence, education institutions, and other experts meeting in Šiauliai University analysed public security and defence matters and considered including the subject into educational programmes of the Baltic States.

The main subject of the debate was presented by Antanas Valys, Vice-Minister of National Defence. Referring to Russia's aggression against Ukraine, Mr Valys said that modern warfare was not limited to conventional military capabilities. "The control of discourse in the media is especially important as it allows influencing the society. As

a result, we find ourselves fighting the information war," he said. According to the Vice-Minister, these factors have an impact on how Lithuania strengthens its defence. "All in all, the overall preparedness of the citizens for defence becomes a matter of national security. The notion of civil resistance is expanding. Armed resistance is just one of the ways among a variety of means that citizens may employ to withstand an aggressor. It could also include words, computers, social media, and all things imaginable," Mr Valys said.
