



On 28 July 2022, Lithuania and the United States will celebrate the centenary of their diplomatic relations. While our historical and cultural connections span over much more than a century, the establishment of diplomatic ties between Lithuania and the U.S. in 1922 formalised the enduring bonds between our two countries. Both during the years of occupation and years of independence, Lithuania demonstrated the will and leadership in international efforts to defend the common transatlantic values of democracy, freedom, and human dignity at home and abroad. Today, our countries enjoy praiseworthy and ever-growing relations. A lot was achieved throughout the 100 years, while we collectively continued to strive for peace, prosperity, and freedom for ourselves and others. Nevertheless, it should not be forgotten that we are entering a new era where strengthening of the transatlantic ties, especially the ties with the United States as our long-standing partner, is more important than ever before. Regardless of the past achievements, there is even more to be done in the changing geopolitical environment of today. Therefore, the goal of this Conference is to use the solid foundation of freedom to further advocate for peace and democratic values worldwide, standing in opposition to the autocratic regimes.

The Centenary Conference will be convened on **7 July 2022**. The event will be organised by the Seimas of the Republic of Lithuania and the Parliamentary Forum for Democracy, in cooperation with the U.S. Embassy in Lithuania, the National Endowment for Democracy (NED), and the International Republican Institute. The event aims to bring together the most prominent political leaders from around the world to discuss the following topics: 1) defining Europe whole and free at the beginning of the end of Putin's regime; 2) global arena of the fight for freedom and the future of democracy.

The event follows a tradition of the President Valdas Adamkus Conference, which was the most prestigious strategic annual event held in Vilnius. Attended by a host of political figures, journalists and political analysts from across Europe and the USA, the Conference focused on topics of importance not only to Eastern Europe, but also to the entire transatlantic community. The first Valdas Adamkus Conference convened in August 2017 discussed the need for regional leadership. In 2018, the Conference focused on Russia's European future and the strategic transatlantic agenda aimed at restoring our resilience. In 2019, the discussion centred on the partnership for transatlantic energy cooperation as well as the need for a new, more effective, and strategy-driven Eastern policy. Today, President Valdas Adamkus has become a symbol of a strong transatlantic partnership and of the aspiration for freedom in Central and Eastern Europe.
