Your personal data will be processed for subscriptions purposes.

**LEGAL BASIS FOR  
PROCESSING**  
(What is the legal basis for  
processing your data?)

Please be informed that the processing of your personal data for subscription purposes is carried out on the basis of your consent (Article 6(1)(a) of the General Data Protection Regulation). In other words, subscribing is optional, but if you choose to subscribe, you will need to provide your personal data.

**DATA RECIPIENTS**

Please be informed that in the cases specified by law and where the provision of personal data is necessary and proportionate for legitimate and specific purposes, your personal data may be transferred to courts or other institutions entitled to receive such data.

**DATA PROCESSORS (insofar as they provide services to the Office of the Seimas)** Information technology companies that process data to ensure the development, improvement and maintenance of the register and information systems.

**THIRD COUNTRIES (all non-EU Member States and non-EEA countries)**

Provision of data to other third parties, including those located in third countries, is not envisaged.

**STORAGE PERIOD**  
(How long will your data be  
stored?)

Please be informed that your personal data (e-mail) will be stored for the period of validity of the consent, as well as for the purposes of ensuring archiving requirements. If you withdraw your consent, legal acts will no longer be sent to you. However, the data related to the confirmation and withdrawal of consent will be retained for three years after the subscription is cancelled.

This time limit may be extended if personal data is or can be used as evidence or source of information in a pre-trial or other investigation, an investigation by the State Data Protection Inspectorate, as well as in civil, administrative or criminal proceedings

or other cases provided for by law. In this case, personal data may be stored for as long as deemed necessary for these purposes and destroyed immediately when it is deemed no longer necessary.

EXERCISE OF THE RIGHTS  
OF DATA SUBJECTS (What  
rights do you have and how do  
you exercise them?)

As a data subject, you have the right to address the Office of the Seimas regarding the processing of your personal data, i.e. you have the following rights:

- right to receive information about data processing (Articles 13 and 14 of the GDPR);
- right of access (Article 15 GDPR);
- right to rectification (Article 16 GDPR);
- right to erasure ('right to be forgotten') (Article 17 GDPR);

Note: this right can be exercised when at least one of the conditions referred to in Article 17(1) GDPR is met;

- right to restriction of processing (Art. 18 GDPR);

Note: this right can be exercised when at least one of the conditions referred to in Article 18(1) GDPR is met;

- right to transfer personal data (Article 20 GDPR). Note: This right may be exercised provided personal data processing is based on consent and carried out by automated means.

Application to exercise your rights must be submitted in writing to the Office of the Seimas, including electronically. The application must clearly identify both the applicant and the data subject. The identity of the data subject shall be established by means of an identity document or electronic means of communication that allow the proper identification of the individual. Applications submitted by e-mail must be signed with an electronic signature. When information about an individual is requested by a representative, the latter must provide a proof of representation.

Regarding the procedure for implementing the rights of data subjects, we kindly ask you to contact the Data Protection Officer by using the above-mentioned contacts.

WITHDRAWAL OF CONSENT

You can withdraw your consent by clicking on the unsubscribe link in any subscription e-mail and confirming your cancellation by checking the provided box.

SUBMISSION OF  
COMPLAINTS

Please be advised that you have the right to appeal against the actions and/or omissions of the Office of the Seimas to the State Data Protection Inspectorate and to the court in accordance with the procedure established by legal acts, as well as to appeal to the court regarding the actions and/or omissions of the State Data Protection Inspectorate. Before submitting a complaint to the relevant institution, however, we recommend that you contact the Data Protection Officer of the Office of the Seimas by using the above-mentioned contact details.

AUTOMATED DECISION-  
MAKING/PROFILING

Please be informed that your data will not be used to make decisions about you by automated means including profiling. Decision-making by automated means alone refers to decisions that are taken without any human intervention by using technologies based on algorithms. Profiling means evaluation of personal aspects in order to make forecasts, even when no decision is taken, for example, when the Office of the Seimas evaluates personal characteristics (age, sex or nationality) or divides persons into certain categories.
